I. Charge of the (Standing) Faculty Handbook Comm(tFe+C):

Rather, its purpose should be to consider and potentially approve proposed changes to the Handbook brought to it from outeintatituencies. Standing Committee Meetings should be open to all University faculty members and held at a standardized meeting time, such as during the second Friday morning of every month, as with other standing University committeeserfts on the agenda for each meeting should be made available at least a week in advance through InfoCenter. In addition, the FHC chair should explicitly invite constituency groups that might be particularly affected by a proposed modification.
